


San Diego by the Numbers

- Economic powerhouse (Innovation)

Kumeyaay Unceded Lands

San Diego is built upon the unceded territory of the first people of the region (today's Kumeyaay) who have stewarded these lands since time immemorial – and continue to do so today.


Panama Canal to be completed San Diego First U.S. Port of Call
